since which I have been down to Boston. and find the
Island much more damaged. than I could have conceived
of. besides the buildings &c I mentioned the amount was
£1520^{ster}. May destroyed Cist and Curnt &c under written

viz^d 35 Large Locust Trees

250 feet plaind and painted fence & with large gates before

the main^{ly} House Red Seder posts

200 feet board fence round the Cow yard

974^{ft} D^o round the Garden Red Seder post all most ^{new}

13 fruit Trees in the Garden

2000^{ft} more spruce spars poles for fences

1000^{ft} more post and Rails fence 5 rails each

75^{ft} long 5 rail fence underpind with Stone (well good)

2 pumps entirely destroyed

1st D^o much damaged

234 feet open board fence round the Sheep yard

a Bridge Curnt. and the Wharfe where the floor was

Curnt. much Curnt -

one Horse Stable omitted in my last worth about

twenty pounds sterling (M^r Williams says £30 sterling)

but I believe £20 is enough
