At a consecution of the vifters of the college of William and Mary, on the ath day of December 1774, a fratute quas Paffed, of which the following is an entrall.

THE fends of the college being an longer compatent to fupport fo extentive an inftitution. as that which the charter recommends; and when fcience at large cannot be cultivated, that scheme of education being most proper, which a more immediately fubordinate to the leading objects of lociety:

The feanty Ripend lately paid by each feholar for commons, having occasioned a confiderable expense It being just, that students inducted inte the fave-

ral scholarships thould be equally affected by the ocpreciation of money, with the college, fince the original denations on which ney were founded, cannot be new disposed of, but it a depreciated rate.

Experience having proved that the rater parts of ficience have been obstructed in their progress by the maintenance of a grammar fcool within the fame; the learning of which may be acquired effewhere, in a much fhorter rims.

And the necessities of the college rendering it expedient to multiply the fources of revenue by avery poffiole means,

Let there be cherefore fix profesorfhips; the firit of which thall be, Law and Police the fecond Anatomy and Madicine; the third, Neural Palofophy and Markemarics; the fourth, Moral Philosophy, the laws of Nature and of Nations, and the Fine Arts; the fifth, Modern Languages; and the fixth for Brafferton.

The particular method of instruction, to be brfued in each school, shall be subject to the control of the President and Professors, with a committee fix of the vilitors, conferring and voting togethfrom time to time on that subject; their meetings o be called by the President, or by a majority of the Pay the whole demands against it. faid committee.

Euch Professor, except the matter of Brafferten, thall receive from every fludent who attends him one

thousand pounds of tobacco annually.

Commons the 'll ceafe at college. The Prefident and Professors mail allow to some fober and diferest male perfon the use of the college kitchen and garden They faill also hire to him the negroes accustomed to labear in the fame, caking bond with fecurity He hall furnish the feweral students with the different meals, as much price as the Prefedent and Profesfors that efrablife from time to time, to be paid by the ftu lents themselves

Such ftudents as have been, or fhall be, inducted Into fch farthips created on pr vare donations actualy paid or established by the General Asiemply, fall receive, while they remain at college, the inter et of the original fum, at the rate of five per centum er annum, and no more; and scholarsh ps. founded an donation, not yet paid, shall be admitted on the

ame conditions only.

The grammar school shall be disceptioned. A fufficient number of flaves shall be referved for cleaning the college; and if any remain after fuch refervation, and hiring of the flaves belonging to the garden and kitchen as aforefaid, they heall be hired out at public auction.

This statute shall commence in force en the twenty fifth day of December, in the year of our Lord one the find feven bundred and feventy mine.
